INSTALLING YOUR HANDSET

Charge the Battery

- Unpack the handset, battery pack, and battery cover. If you need to remove the cover, press in on the notch and slide the cover down and off.
- 2. Line up the battery connector with the jack inside the handset; the connector only fits one way.
- Push the connector in until it clicks into place; tug gently on the wires to make sure the battery is securely connected.
- 4. Replace the battery cover and slide it into place.
- Use the AC adaptor to connect the power jack on the charger to a regular indoor (240V AC) power outlet.
- Place the handset in the charger with the display facing forward. If the display doesn't light up, reseat the handset or connect the charger to a different outlet.
- 🖎 Charge the handset completely (about 15-20 hours) before using it.

Installing the Shoulder rest Belt clip

Line up the holes on each side of the handset.

To attach the shoulder rest belt clip; Insert into the holes on each side of the handset. Press down until it clicks.

To remove the shoulder rest belt clip; Pull either side of the belt clip to release the tabs from the holes.

Headset Installation

Your handset may be used with the Uniden HS910 headset. To use this feature, insert the headset plug into the headset jack. Your handset is ready for hands-free conversations. Headsets can be purchased online, see the website details on the front cover.

REGISTERING TO A BASE

The accessory handset won't work until you register it to a compatible Uniden cordless phone!

Registration Methods

This handset is designed for use with XDECT 8315 and XDECT 8355 bases

Does the handset fit in the base cradle?				
Yes	Place the handset in the base. The display should say Registering.			
No	Does the base have an LCD display?			
	Yes	On the base, open the menu and select Register Accy. The display should show Registering.		
		On the handset, press and hold #DND until the display shows <i>Registering</i> (about 2 seconds).		
	No	On the base, press and hold FIND when the phone is in standby (about 5 seconds). On the handset, press and hold #DND until the handset display shows <i>Registering</i> (about 2 seconds).		

After about 30 seconds, the handset display should say Registration Complete.

Test the Connection

Pick up the handset and press **HOME/FLASH**. Make sure you get a dial tone. (Press **END** to hang up.)

If	Try	
you don't hear a dial tone the display shows Registration Failed	Making sure the handset is fully charged, before trying again.	

RESETTING THE HANDSET

If you are having trouble with a handset or if you want to replace one, you need to clear the registration information from the base and the handset:

Warranty Period: This warranty to the original retail purchaser is only valid in the original country of purchase for a Product first purchased either in Australia or New Zealand and will expire one (1) year from the date of the original retail sale. If a warranty claim is made, this warranty will not apply if the Product is found by Uniden to be:

- A. Damaged or not maintained in a reasonable manner or as recommended in the relevant Uniden Owner's Manual;
- B. Modified, altered or used as part of any conversion kits, subassemblies or any configurations not sold by Uniden Aust;
- C. Improperly installed contrary to instructions contained in the relevant Owner's Manual
- D. Repaired by someone other than an authorized Uniden Repair Agent in relation to a defect or malfunction covered by this warranty; or
- E. Used in conjunction with any equipment, parts or a system notmanufactured by Uniden.

Parts Covered: This warranty covers the Product and included accessories
